BUILDING CLINICAL ONCOLOGY CAPACITY

Kenyan Pharmacists Strengthen Their Oncology Pharmacy Skills



Following its [2023 AAI Oncology Pharmacy Digital Lecture Series](#), BVGH held an on-site training program in Kenya to build upon the digital training topics and refine attendees' oncology pharmacy knowledge and skills. Held at Kenyatta National Hospital (KNH), the AAI on-site training was attended by 40 pharmacists from 23 Kenyan hospitals. BVGH engaged oncology pharmacy experts Dr. Alexandre Chan, Professor of Clinical Pharmacy, University of California, Irvine, and Dr. Nancy Guo, Senior Pharmacist, Ontario

Ministry of Health and Clinical Lead of Quality and Safety, Kingston Health Sciences Centre, to lead the lectures, which covered the safe handling of chemotherapy, pharmacology, site specific SOPs, and supportive care. Following the AAI program, all participants noted that they planned to incorporate their new knowledge into their daily practice and share their learnings with their colleagues and students.

BVGH's [AAI Palliative Care Digital Training Program \(English\)](#), which attracted 1,816 attendees from 34 African countries, concluded in November 2023. Upon popular demand and participant feedback, BVGH organized two workshops for AAI hospital partners to practice the communication strategies that they learned during the digital training. The workshops, which covered breaking bad news and communicating a cancer prognosis, began with a review of palliative care communication principles led by Dr. Frank Ferris, Executive Director of Palliative Medicine, Research and Education, OhioHealth. Attendees subsequently transitioned into small breakout groups, during which they participated in role-play scenarios depicting patient-clinician interactions and received feedback from their peers. BVGH coordinated the breakout group discussions which were facilitated by experts from Centre Hospitalier Public d'Hauteville, The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center, and the Institute for Oncology and Radiology of Serbia.

Grant Writers Gain Invaluable Skills through AAI Digital Training Course

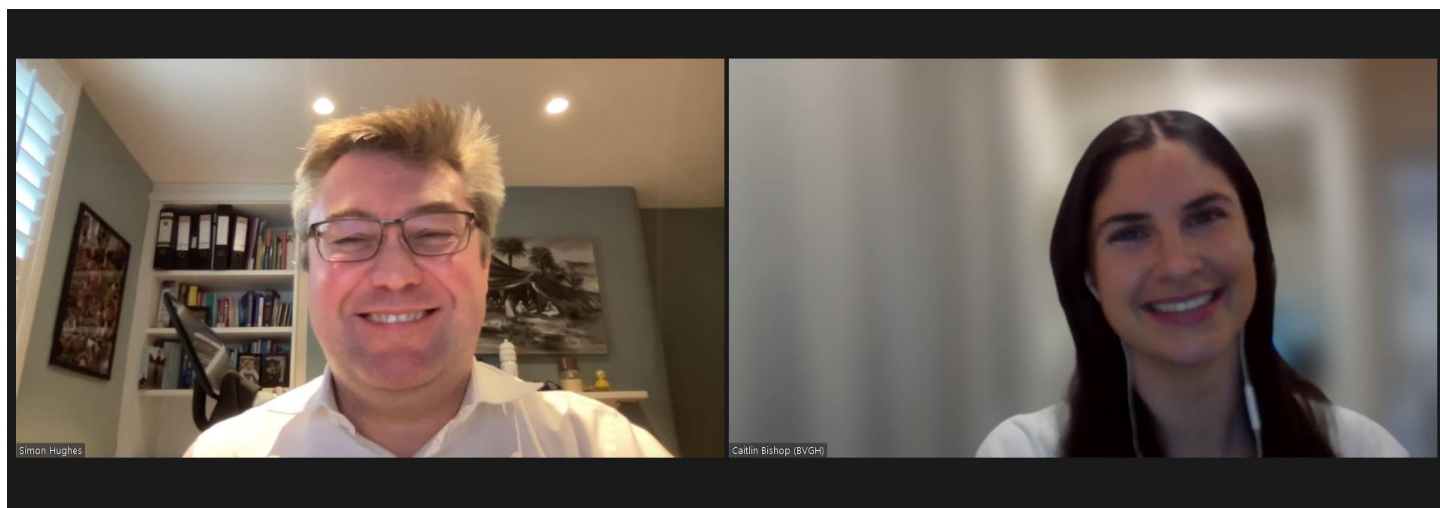
Applying for grants and fellowships is a crucial part of moving innovative research projects forward, expanding educational opportunities, and increasing cancer care availability at hospitals. Yet the application process can be daunting and discouraging. To help demystify the funding application process, BVGH created the [2023 AAI Introduction to Grant Writing](#) digital course. Reaching over 5,200 healthcare providers, researchers, and grant writing professionals from 102 countries, the lecture series included speakers from the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Wellcome Trust, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, MD Anderson, and the University of South Florida.

The digital training program began with a series of lectures that covered how to craft the body of a grant application – from writing a CV and requesting letters of support to making a budget and timeline for the project – before transitioning into presentations on what funders, editors, and reviewers are looking for. The 10-session series concluded with a lecture from Dr. Mwando Chitula, Oncology Specialist, Cancer Diseases Hospital, Zambia, who spoke about her own experiences with grant applications, successful grant management, and how finding a mentor was a game-changer for her career and success. Following the lecture series, interested participants were invited to a Peer Review Workshop to learn more about the peer review process, review a peer's work, and have their work reviewed in return.

BVGH Delivers Targeted Training on Prostate Cancer

Prostate cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related death among African men. Oncology experts across BVGH's AAI hospitals have expressed an urgent need for additional training in the diagnosis and treatment of prostate cancer to address this devastating disease. In response, BVGH delivered a [six-session AAI digital training program](#) covering topics in prostate cancer diagnosis, management of disease by risk group, common oncologic emergencies, and palliative care. The course curriculum covered topics prioritized by AAI hospitals and was developed by BVGH and Dr. Simon Hughes, Clinical Oncologist, Guy's and St. Thomas' NHS Trust, and refined with further input from clinical staff at NSIA-LUTH Cancer Center (NLCC) in Nigeria. Expert trainers from the Fred Hutch Cancer Center, Guy's and St. Thomas' NHS Trust, Lancaster University, and the African Center for Research on End of Life Care (ACREOL) led sessions that incorporated lectures, interactive case studies, and participant Q&A. More than 725 individuals from 41 countries registered for the course.



BVGH's AAI to be Presented at American Association for Cancer Research (AACR)

At the upcoming AACR Meeting (April 5-10), BVGH President and CEO Jennifer Dent will be speaking on the panel "Optimizing Cancer Care in Low Resource Settings" on the topic of readiness for clinical cancer research in low- and middle-income countries. This panel will take place on Monday, April 8th at 5pm PST.
