

CHILDHOOD CANCERS

signs to look for



Repeating or constant fevers



Persisting headaches or dizziness

Pain, swelling, or a hard bump on the belly



Lump in child's neck, belly, chest, or armpit

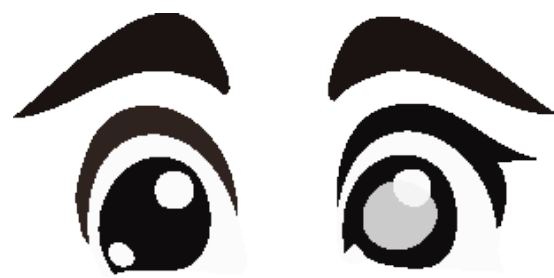


Persistent nausea or vomiting



Pale skin on hands, lips, gums, tongue, or nail beds

White spot in the eye, bulging eyeball, or new squint



Gum swelling, loose or crooked teeth; bone or joint swelling/pain

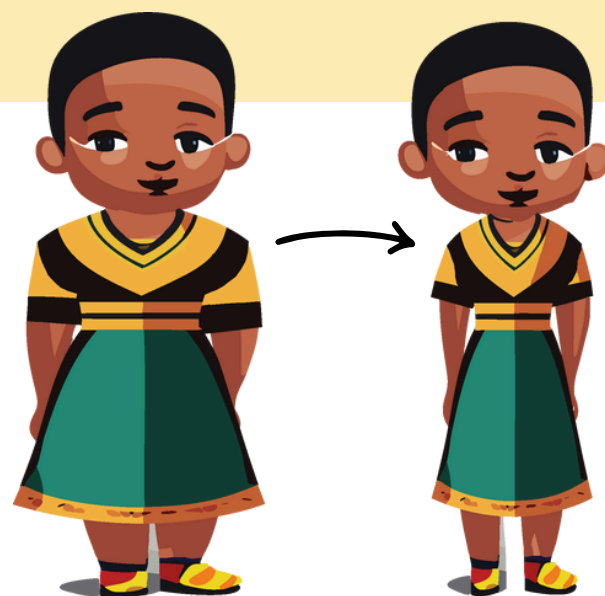


Feeling tired or weak



Vision, hearing, or speech problems

Unexplained weight loss



Easy bruising/bleeding or constant infections



Visit a doctor right away if you notice your child has any of these signs.

Childhood cancer may be **treatable** when caught early!
